
Our worship has continued on line and in person:

Church services

We now have a regular service pattern:

- 8.30am Said Holy Communion
- 9.30am Family Service with children's groups
- 11.00am Traditional style service with Holy Communion on the 2nd and 4th Sundays
- Booking on Eventbrite continues to operate for the family service (9.30am) for the purpose of recording attendance for schools and the links are posted monthly on the website and all our social media.
- If you do not require your attendance to be recorded for school admission purposes then there is no need to book now.

- 11am service has continued to be live streamed(except on the occasional Sunday when we have had technical issues!)
- Our seating has been reinstated to accommodate increased numbers.
- Notices encourage people to continue to wear face coverings 'as a courtesy to others we respectfully ask you to wear a face covering whilst in our church buildings'
- Hand sanitiser is made available for people to use when entering the building
- The building has continued to be well ventilated
- Communion wafers will continue to be used and administered in the existing format
- Singing has been introduced

The implications of the recent Government announcements regarding lifting of Covid restrictions will be discussed by the church leadership team over the coming weeks but for the time being we will continue to encourage mask wearing in church, the use of hand sanitisers and will keep the building well ventilated.

Feast of Fun

With a grant from Together Liverpool we ran a healthy eating event on **Saturday 16th October** in the Hilltop Centre aimed at pre school children based on the story of The Very Hungry Caterpillar. It was lovely to see families come along and enjoy some fun together.



We were also able to donate recipe bags of food to our local food bank Big thank you to everyone that helped make this event happen and to Together Liverpool for the generous grant.
