• We have great news to share!

We are delighted to be able to announce that we have appointed a new Rector!

We will be welcoming **Revd Rachel Archer** to St Matthew and St James Mossley Hill as our new Rector. We really look forward to seeing what God has planned for us as we welcome Rachel in what is likely to be early 2023. Rachel is presently working as a Curate in Bromley in the Diocese of Rochester in Kent. She and her husband Chris and their 2 sons Theo & Noah will be relocating to join us and we really look forward to welcoming the family to Mossley Hill. Timings of when this will be are yet to be confirmed but should follow shortly.

A message from the Archdeacon of Liverpool Archdeacon Mike McGurk:

Rachel was ordained in the Diocese of Rochester and as a former teacher Rachel brings extensive experience of working with children and young people and will bring an array of skills to not only the parish but also to the wider Deanery. On the Sunday before the funeral we had a service of commemoration and our church flag was put at half mast throughout the mourning period.




School Applications
